12) **DAFI** Albert Einstein German Academic Refugee Initiative (DAFI)

The UNHCR of the United Nations administers the Albert Einstein German Academic Refugee Initiative (DAFI) to help refugees afford the cost of post-secondary education. Through the program, recognized refugees can receive free tuition as well as money for books, transportation, housing and food. The program is open to applicants who hold a secondary school diploma, have demonstrated financial need, enroll in a program where the likelihood of employment is high and are under 28 years of age. Only one DAFI award is given out per family. Applicants must be from one of the countries specified by the UNHCR. A full list is available on their website.

EPSO is an independent academic organisation that represents more than 200 research institutes, departments and universities from 31 countries in Europe and beyond. The idea is to facilitate refugee scientists in finding a host lab abroad.

21) The Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowships

The Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowships for New Americans is a scholarship program offered to immigrants and refugees in the United States. In order to qualify for the scholarship program, applicants must be planning to attend a graduate-level degree program at an accredited American university on a full-time basis. The scholarships can be awarded to US citizens whose parents were born abroad or who are not US citizens as well as to individuals who were born abroad but are naturalized citizens, adopted by US citizens, green card holders or refugee status. Those who were born abroad but graduated from an American high school may also be eligible.

28) Volkswagen Stiftung – Gastforschungsprogramm für geflohene ukrainische Wissenschaftler*innen

Deadline: any time

Eligibility: Ukrainian academics who were forced to flee from their country to Germany or will arrive in Germany in the next couple of weeks. The host institution will be a university or research institution in Germany.

Duration: 6 to 12 months

Funding: monthly stipend of 1.500 EUR for PhD candidates / 2.100 EUR for researchers with a PhD doctorate. For additional information please consult the following document here.

29) Philipp-Schwartz-Initiative (Alexander von Humboldt Foundation)

Deadline: March 18 2022 (for Ukrainian scholars at risk), March 4 2022 (scholars at risk of other nationalities)

Eligibility: <u>Ukrainian scholars at risk</u> & researchers of other nationalities who are demonstrably at risk – irrespective of discipline and country of origin – are eligible for sponsorship. At-risk status can be verified ither by

- a residence status in the context of an asylum-granting procedure within the EU that confirms a recognised threat
- or a credible threat assessment issued by a third party, such as the SAR Network or the Council At-Risk Academics (CARA), within the previous 12 months
- researchers should have completed a PhD or comparable academic degree;
- are not yet or have not been resident outside their own country for more than 5 years at the time of application;
- have the language skills required to successfully conduct their research project;
- can provide proof of their academic qualifications in the form of relevant publications and
- have the potential to be integrated into the (academic) employment market

Duration: 24 months, with the possibility of extension by 12 months

Funding: The Philipp Schwartz Initiative enables universities and research institutions in Germany to host researchers at risk on the basis of a full fellowship. Accordingly, host institutions receive funding which is composed of two components:

- <u>Fellowship amount:</u> Sponsorship covers a fixed-amount fellowship or contractual employment. It is earmarked for a period of up to 24 months; application may be made during the initial fellowship period for an extension of up to 12 months in the framework of a co-financing model.
- <u>Allowance for host institution:</u> The host institution receives a lump sum allowance of 20,000 EUR for each individual sponsored.
